- Provide you with first-hand experiences of what it's like to be a woman leader in politics

Enrolment Requirements

- You identify as a woman or gender diverse/non-binary
- You have a GPA of 3.0 or higher and are in the equivalent of third year or higher (undergraduate) or are currently enrolled as an MA student in any program, full or part-time
- You have considered the time commitment involved in an experiential learning course which involves field trips, events, and networking activities
- You agree to the Student Code of Conduct and that you will follow all security and health requirements of the legislatures/locations we visit
- You consent to shadow and engage respectfully with politicians from every major party and everyone we meet



You have submitted an application by November 21st

Application Process

Submit your application by November 21st 5 PM

The application will ask you to provide a statement of interest (300 words), a list of previous experiences such as volunteer activities, work experiences or courses taken on gender/women and an unofficial copy of your transcript in PDF (undergraduate only)

All applicants will be notified by December 10th or after students have been given their Winter 2025 schedules

Remember that if you accept and then drop the course, you will be denying another student the opportunity to be in the program


Once accepted, undergraduates will be registered in POG 494. MA students will need to seek permission from their program to take the course as a directed study with Professor Raney.

Competitive process; total number of students accepted varies year to year and depends 8 on the number of applications we receive and our funding limitations
