Look Globally - Act Locally: Integrating Care in the Community for Vulnerable Populations

October 20, 2008 Richmond Hill. ON

The Canadian Research Network for Care in the Community (CRNCC) in partnership with the Ontario Community Support Association (OCSA) presented its fourth symposium in an annual series of fall symposia highlighting crucial issues in home and community care, globally, nationally, and locally.
