### MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR

Welcome to the fourth **Annual Research and Achievement Report** for the Department of Psychology at Ryerson University, highlighting contributions for the 2014-2015 academic year. The accomplishments of our faculty, postdocs, and students comprise 60 pages of diverse contributions spanning all major areas of Psychology, as well as a number of related fields. The report includes awards, honours, grants, publications, presentations, media interviews, and various other contributions over the previous year.

Here are some highlights of the report, which includes contributions from June 2014 through May 2015:

#### Summary of Research Accomplishments

- More than 40 prestigious external awards and honors
- Appointment of the Psychology Department's first Canada Research Chair
- A number of national and international conferences hosted by the Department
- Several university-wide research awards received by faculty members
- 27 new external faculty research grants, representing more than \$5.5 million in funding
- 155 peer reviewed journal publications
- · 68 books and book chapters published
- 12 other publications
- 271 poster and conference presentations
- · 81 external workshops, invited lectures, and colloquia

#### **Undergraduate Program**

- We received 2868 applications for Fall 2014 admission to our BA program. A total of 133 students were admitted, with a mean incoming average of 86.6%. All incoming students were eligible for entrance scholarships based on their grades
- The Psychology Students' Association held a number of events over the year, including its fourth annual Welcome Day (August 2014), a thesis information session, tours of the Centre for

- Addiction and Mental Health, and several social events (for example, a Halloween Party and a Welcome Back Pub Night in January 2015)
- In April 2015, our Undergraduate Honours Thesis Poster Session was held, showcasing 20 different research projects conducted by students registered in the thesis stream option of our undergraduate program.

#### **Graduate Programs**

- We received over 350 applications for Fall 2014 admission to our MA/PhD program. 21 new students were admitted across our Psychological Science and Clinical Psychology streams.
- 13 students received their doctoral degrees in 2014-2015, and have since taken up a number of highly sought after positions. Examples include faculty positions (University of Manitoba), postdoctoral fellowships (e.g., at the Ontario Institute of Technology, McMaster University, and Western University), and positions in clinical research, private clinical practice, and business consulting.
- Our latest cohort of clinical psychology students matched for their predoctoral internships in February 2015. Despite an 84% success rate across Canada (for the first match), 100% of Ryerson University students matched with an internship placement for the fourth year in a row. This is particularly impressive, given that 15 students (our largest number ever) were enrolled in the APPIC match.
- Clinical Psychology PhD student, Andrew Brankley, became the first graduate student in our program to hold a prestigious

Vanier Canada Graduate Scholarship, totaling \$150,000 over 3 years.

In November 2014, the Psychology Graduate Students'
Association hosted their annual Psychology Research
Symposium, an event celebrating the research of the
department's current graduate students. Keynote speaker,
Dr. Candice Monson gave an excellent presentation entitled,
Reconceptualizing PTSD and enhancing treatment: Cognitivebehavioural conjoint therapy for PTSD, after which the event
continued with several graduate student talks and a well
attended poster session featuring graduate student research
in the Department.

#### Other Highlights

- Dr. Julia Spaniol became the first member of Ryerson's
   Psychology Department to hold a Canada Research Chair.
   Dr. Spaniol is Director of the Memory and Decision Processes
   Lab and holds a 5-year, Tier 2, Canada Research Chair in
   Cognitive Aging.
- In July 2014, the Department welcomed to Ryerson Dr. Paul Brunet as an assistant professor (limited term). We also welcomed two new postdoctoral fellows (Drs. Todd Coleman and Syed Noor) and a new Undergraduate Program Assistant (Shadi Sibani).
- Psychology offered 64 courses through the Chang School of Continuing Education, including our 8-course Certificate In Psychology, our 10-Course certificate in Mental Health and Addictions, and various standalone courses. In Winter 2015,

- we repeated our popular postbaccalaureate continuing education course (focused on clinical supervision). 3100 students enrolled in our CE courses last year.
- In July 2014, Ryerson University hosted more than 400 delegates at the annual meeting of the Canadian Society for Brain, Behaviour, and Cognitive Science (CSBBCS). Nearly 350 presentations were given throughout the meeting including paper sessions, posters, and symposia on topics such as animal behaviour, auditory processes, and mathematical cognition to name a few.
- In June 2015, we held our annual Psychology Research and Awards Celebration at the Arts and Letters Club of Toronto where over 45 of our undergraduate and graduate students were honoured with various internal and external awards. In addition, over 80 Psychology students (the highest number of any department in the Faculty of Arts) were on the Dean's List, in recognition of their accomplishments during the 2014-2015 academic year.
- The Psychology Department welcomed close to 500
   practitioners to Ryerson University for 2-day workshops by Dr.
   Colleen Carney (Treatment of Insomnia, October 2014) and Dr.
   Candice Monson (Cognitive Processing Therapy for PTSD, May 2015). All funds generated by these workshops are earmarked for funding graduate student travel to conferences.
- Psychology Department members were quoted in over 30 media outlets, including CBC Radio, Global News, Globe and Mail, New York Times, PBS Nova, Readers Digest, Real Simple Magazine, and USA Today, to name a few.

On behalf of my co-editors and the entire Department of Psychology, we hope you find this report to be informative, and we look forward to sharing next year's accomplishments in our 2015-2016 report, scheduled for publication by Fall 2016.


