Thanks to each one of our employer partners, students have collectively earned over \$160M, since 2017.

Drawing from student work terms reports and employer engagement data, we have identified a select group of Co-op employers making a true difference in the lives of our students.

In this inaugural year only, we also celebrate our *Top Legacy Employers*—those who have stood by us from the beginning, hiring students for more than 100 Co-op work terms.



Legacy Employers

The *Legacy Employer* category recognizes employers who played a major role in the long-term growth of the Ted Rogers Co-op Program, and have hired more than 100 students on work terms since 2017.



Top Employer by Industry

The *Top Employer by Industry* category recognizes those employers who hired the most students this past year, as defined by the total number of work terms.
