Marked by tailored suits, classic dresses, and polished accessories, it stands apart from the more relaxed feel of Business Casual or Business Professional.

Business Casual

Business casual dress codes are common for day-to-day office wear in the majority of organizations. The term 'casual' is defined differently in different industries, so gauge what your co-workers are wearing and what that industry's standard is. See below for examples of what to wear in a business casual setting.

Women's Attire

Dress pants should not have any distressing. Midi or maxi skirts are also acceptable with minimalist colours.

Dress shoes or boots are optimal. Some industries are okay with sneakers, do your research beforehand!

Men's Attire

Plain collared shirt with optional tie depending on the occasion.

Full length dress pants or chino pants are great options.

Any closed-toe shoes with nonbright colours (preferably leather shoes).

Business Professional

Business professional dress codes is a more conservative style of dress that is common in the banking, accounting, government, and legal sectors. For networking events, it's recommended to stick to a business professional dress code to leave a positive impression. See below for examples of what to wear in a business professional setting.

Women's Attire

Sophisticated top with a high neckline. Blazers with dress shirts are always a safe bet as well.

Full length mid-to-high waisted dress pants or midi-to-maxi skirt. Opt for neutral colours wherever possible.

Leather closed-toe shoes or modest high heels are great options.

Men's Attire

A collared shirt is necessary and fitted blazer with tie optional.
